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# Introducing Oldenburg

stainless steel case with black dial



The Oldenburg breed was created in the 17th Century through the endeavors of Count Johann XVI von Oldenburg and Count Anton Gunther von Oldenburg to create a grand carriage horse. Small breeding farms throughout the provinces of Oldenburg and East Friesland were developed. These original Oldenburgs were based on native Friesian stock, with Turkish, Neopolitan, Spanish, Danish and Andalusian influences. In 1950, the objectives of cavalry gave way to those of sport. Until this time Thoroughbred blood was used sporadically, but in 1959 crossings to athletic Thoroughbred stallions began in earnest. By allowing other breeds into their studbook, the Oldenburg Verband was able to create a superb sporthorse. This policy remains today, and breeders can choose the best stallions as long as they are approved and listed in the Oldenburg studbooks. Breeds include Trakehner, Westphalian, Holsteiner and Hanoverian.

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# Oldenburg



Black enamel dial on Stainless Steel case creates a powerful design on this exquisite timepiece. Oldenburg is a Warmblood horse from the northwestern region of Lower Saxony. Characterized by its solid frame and with powerful dark features, Oldengburg is synonymous with Confidence, and it is for those seeking control without attracting too much attention.

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# Introducing Mangalarga

The Mangalarga Marchador is the national horse of Brazil and its genealogy is rich with horses from the Iberian Peninsula. Sublime, the foundation stallion of the Marchador, was a product of horses brought to Brazil by the Portuguese royal family in the early 1800s. Sublime was put to mares of the gaited Spanish Jennet, Criollos, Andalusians and the Barb. These were called Sublime horses, but the breed's name was later changed to Mangalarga Marchador; a nod to the first hacienda that embraced the breed. In Sao Paolo the Marchador was crossed with Thoroughbred, Arabian and American Saddlebred, which led to another registry; the Mangalarga Paulista. The Mangalarga Marchador remains a pure breed, unchanged since the 1800s. The horses are used for polo, jumping, endurance riding and leisure pursuits.

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# Introducing Akhal Teke

With its unusual, gazelle-like appearance, the Akhal-Teke (Ah-cull Tek-y) is an incredibly distinctive breed. Experts say the Akhal-Teke breed is at least 3,000 years old. The Akhal-Teke may be the last remaining strain of the Turkmene (a horse that has existed since 2400 B.C.). In the Middle Ages (500 to 1500 A.D.), Akhal-Tekes lived with nomadic tribesmen near the Kopet Dag Mountains in Turkmenistan. The nomads treated the horses as part of their families, tethering them near their shelters. In the early 1900s, Russians used Akhal-Tekes as cavalry horses. Today they excel in sport, particularly in racing, show jumping, dressage and endurance racing.

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# Akhal Teke



The best kept secret of the Thoroughbred collection, Akhal-Teke is an intelligent choice for anyone seeking a stylish yet powerful timepiece. This watch features a rose gold case with black enamel dial and it is named after a breed dating back 3000 years. Also known as the "Golden Horse," Akhal-Teke is known by its shiny coat of palomino with graceful muscle frame, which makes it's a prized possession.

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# Introducing Andalusian

stainless steel with light grey dial



Hailing from the Iberian Peninsula, the Andalusian takes its name from the Province of Andalucia, where it was most famous. This living antiquity is purported to be an ancient breed; 20,000-year-old cave drawings show a similar type of horse and Homer mentions the horses in the Illiad (1,100 B.C.). During the Moorish invasion in 711 A.D., Andalusians were bred to the invader's horses, the Spanish Barbs. In Spain, the horses are called Pura Raza Espanola (Pure Spanish Race). The Andalusian is the foundation for the Lippizzaner and many other world breeds, such as the Peruvian Paso. The Andalusian excels in dressage and traditional Spanish equestrian pursuits, such as bull fighting and ranch work.

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# Andalusian



One of our Flagship models, this timepiece features a Stainless Steel case with light grey enamel dial. Named after a Pure Spanish Horse, Andalusian, this model features a strong built with a touch of elegance. It derives its name from the place of origin – the Spanish region of Andalusia. One seeking an elegant and classy piece with a strong feel to it, cannot go wrong with the Andalusian.

## Care Guide

Stranger watch requires periodic maintenance for optimal performance. Maintenance includes complete disassembly, cleaning, replacement of parts as needed, reassembly and lubrication of the movement.

A maintenance interval of 3 to 5 years is recommended, in addition to any required battery replacement. Never open the watch yourself. If your watch needs repair or adjustment, take or mail it directly to Stranger Time Inc.

### **SHOCK**

All Stranger watches have shock-resistant movements, and are tested to meet international standards for shock resistance.

### **DUST**

Dust can enter a watch if the case, crystal or crown is not intact. A small particle is enough to stop the movement. Have your watch repaired promptly if the crystal becomes loose, chipped, or if there is damage to the case or crown.

### **MAGNETISM**

The exposure of a timepiece to strong magnetic fields will affect its time-keeping, and may cause it to stop. A mechanical timepiece may require demagnetization before it will operate again.

### **WATER RESISTANCE**

All Stranger watches are tested to meet international standards for water resistance. Most models are water resistant to 5ATM; certain models are water resistant to even greater pressures/depths, as marked on the dial or case back.

**IMPORTANT:** Do not operate the watch crown, push-buttons on a chronograph model, or any other pushers/ buttons when the timepiece is wet or under water.

**NOTE:** Stranger Time will not be responsible for any damage caused by or related to leakage originating from improper handling or damage to the case, crown, gaskets or crystal.

**OTHER PRECAUTIONS:** If your watch is equipped with a screw-down crown, be sure to screw it back down into the case after every operation.

## Care Guide

Water resistance applies only to the watch case and does not apply to Strap and/or Bracelet; some watch straps should not be worn under water or subjected to wet conditions.

Do not drop your watch or hit it against a hard surface. Water resistance must be rechecked after every violent shock.

Clean your watch regularly by wiping it with a soft cloth dampened with fresh water. Avoid exposing your watch to sudden and excessive temperature variations.

### **STRAP CARE**

While the life span of a watch strap depends on your care and wearing habits, as well as the climate in which you live, proper care will extend its life.

Leather straps should be kept dry. Exposure to water may cause a leather watch strap to become brittle and eventually break. Following exposure to chlorinated or salt water, gently damp wipe your leather strap with fresh water, and air dry.

Use warm water and a neutral soap applied to a soft cloth to gently clean a white silicone strap; then wipe with a second clean cloth dipped in warm water, or rinse carefully under warm running water.

Stranger watch straps are not covered by Stranger Time Inc warranty.



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## 2 Year Warranty

All Stranger watches are covered by the international 24 month warranty.

Stranger Time will, within two years from date of purchase, repair or replace, at Stranger's option, the movement of your timepiece free of charge if such movement proves to be defective in material or workmanship under normal use.

This warranty does not cover damage or defects arising from accidents, misuse or neglect, or from any alterations, service or repair performed by any party other than Stranger Time or an authorized Stranger Time service center.

This warranty does not cover batteries, straps, bracelets, crystals, or cases; and is void if the timepiece was not purchased from an authorized Stranger Time dealer.

Any other warranty provided by the retailer, is entirely their responsibility. No person or company is authorized to change the terms of this warranty. This warranty gives the consumer specific legal rights. He/she may also have other statutory rights which may vary from state to state, and country to country

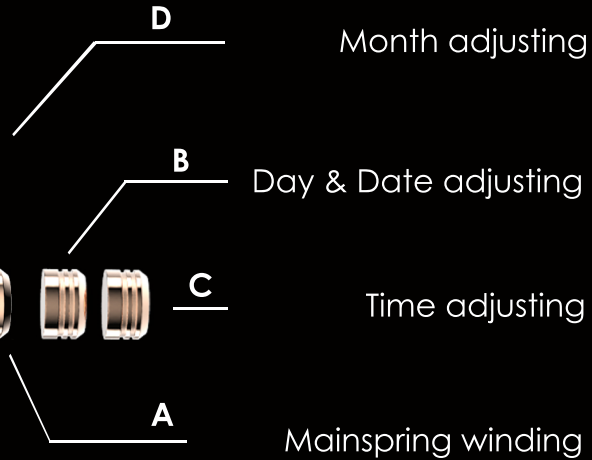


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# Operating Method



## Winding the mainspring

Automatic winding watch can be also manual-winded by turning the crown in "A" position. Wind 15-20 times clockwise until second hand starts to move naturally

## Adjusting Day

Adjust the day by rotating the crown counter-clockwise in "B" position

## Adjusting Date

Adjust the Date by rotating the crown clockwise in "B" position

## Adjusting Time

Rotate the crown in "C" position and adjust the standart time. Then check if it is morning or afternoon adjust correctly

## Adjust Month

Push the button "D" and adjust the month.

**NOTE:** If the button is not pushed to the end, the month is not changed perfectly
